### **Emergency Preparedness Presentation**

- Terry Gomez, Health and Safety Manager gave a presentation about Emergency Preparedness
- Each school should have 8 emergency drills every year, 6 evacuation drills, 1 lockdown and 1 hold and secure.
- The district provides a tarp, tent, nylon rope, bottled water, foil blankets, first aid kits, crowbar, flashlights, megaphone, hard hats, small radio, and bags.
- All teachers/classes should have 'go bags'.
- A principal must email if they do not have any of these supplies.
- PAC can provide hygiene paper, first aid kits, granola bars, larger tents, water, additional means of communication
- Emergency kiosks are funded by PACs
- Stoney Creek Elementary gave a presentation of their own preparation

# <u>Budget</u>

- The provincial budget will be released at the end of February.
- School districts will receive their funds in March which will begin the budget process.
- All districts need to pass a balanced budget by June 30, but the budget will be passed earlier to address staffing.
- PACs will be consulted on April 11 & 18 regarding the budget.
- Please note that Burnaby schools had an additional 1000 students this year that were not projected.
- The increase in student enrolment has and will require the purchase of portables.
- The structural deficit is growing. The reserve balance was 10.9 million at the start of the school year but 5 million will be used this year.

### Misc. Business

- Alpha and Mountain Secondary schools are both piloting 'bring your device' programs. Parents brought up concerns around equity and access.
- Questions arose around communication from a lockdown at Mountain Secondary. There will be a presentation in the spring regarding this.
- A question about school doors being opened and inquiring about a district policy were brought up. There is no district policy it is a site dependent/school choice.

# Treasurer's Report: Roula

- A few updates to our school budget
- 185.39 for Valentine's Day cards and treats for students
- Stereo equipment budget went up to \$7098.64.
