	has not been received yet, and there are still outstanding expenses for Fun	
	Lunches. No other changes since the Oct. budget and statement	
	presentation.	
	• The budget shows a deficit under the Grade 7 category as fundraising was	
	a mess last year and a lot of bills weren't paid last year. One cheque was	
	missed that was written two months ago, but just got cashed last week, so	
	 Sandra will determine how best to adjust this deficit. \$8000 is put towards the playground, rest is surplus.

Principal's Report (Andrew Lee)	 Mr. Lee forwarded discussion among teachers regarding desired programming, and included Young Actors Theatre, Selina Noon (in the process of being booked for this year), as well as a desire for Internet Safety and Tennis for next year. The teacher-led Tech Committee has compiled a tech wish-list and is currently figuring out a process to prioritize the list. Currently, the cost is approximately \$12,000. Items include, but are not limited to, mounted projectors and document readers. The list will be brought to PAC once it has been prioritized. School Sports: Volleyball is ongoing.
