Treasurer's Report (Sandra Benholm)	<ul> <li>Final budget was proposed.</li> <li>If bottles are retuned at Metrotown Bottle Return (Imperial Street), proceeds go to Suncrest if you say it goes to Suncrest Elementary.</li> <li>Fun Lunches looks like they are more profitable because money hasn't gone out yet for upcoming food orders yet.</li> <li>We have an Angel Fund for someone who needs money for a field trip or other school expenses.</li> <li>Supplementary Resources are available for teachers to choose how they would like to spend, not just limited to jump math as other years. There is more flexibility for things such as Raz Kids.</li> <li>Emergency preparedness we will need more funds.</li> <li>Technology funds were finally used for the iPads, which was just cleared now from last year.</li> <li>Surplus from gaming grant, we are planning on using money for school wide programs (such as martial arts).</li> <li>When the budget was set, there were 31 students in grade 7, there are now 32 students, which needs to be updated.</li> <li>Currently we have \$26,841.87 in the bank, less some outstanding cheques, so the adjusted bank balance is: \$25,573.00</li> </ul>	Corina motioned to approve budget. Action Items/ Votes  After school online survey for after school activities is available and parents are encouraged to provide feedback. Programs at Suncrest seem to be going well. If you ever see a program full, put your name on the waitlist, so that they can add another instructor and add more kids. Burnaby Parks & Rec is open to new programs. Please give suggestions. Some suggestions by parents were: Yoga for older kids; hadminton; babysitting: first aid guitar lessons; baskeball; leadership; and, drama. Bytes camp is an option for technology based programs, they are non-profit programs, but more expensive. Update on school patrol: we will not be sending our children out into the construction area, as the city workers themselves are having difficulties with traffic control, leaving if dangerous for our children in such a complex traffic environment. Parents are encouraged to come with their children to the crosswalks as the roads are dangerous. Martial Arts has finished, with the addition of a day because the instructor was away for a day. Children liked it. Volleyball has started, games are on Thursday and will continue into December.  Earthquake drill will be on October 20, 2016. Book fair is next week (Oct 24-27) Because there are so many things in October, Celebration of Learning will be postponed. Remembrance Day on November 10 <sup>th</sup> , parents welcome. School wide programs: teachers are gathering information still for that. Teachers say thank you for contributing. Salcema Noon is preferred for sexual health education. The other issue is Digital Safety, but is full for this year, so perhaps could be booked for next year. This would fall under the gaming grant if the PAC chooses to provide a contribution.
